A typical household spends 10 to 15 percent of its energy budget on lighting. If you make your next four lightbulb replacements ENERGY STAR, you will see an annual savings of about \$44. The savings add up because a Compact Fluorescent light bulb (CFL) lasts up to 5 years. Use less energy, save money, and reap the many other benefits of efficient lighting. 
